LICENSED OCCUPATIONS IN THE SECURITY INDUSTRY

SECURITY GUARD/SECURITY OFFICER

This licence authorises you to watch, guard and protect property. Holders of this type of licence are sometimes known as 'Security Guards.'

Duties include:

- patrol areas and check doors, gates and windows for signs of unauthorised entry;
- watch for irregularities (e.g. fire hazards, leaking water pipes, lights left on,
- malfunctions of equipment or machinery, unlocked security doors) and report incidents or problems to the appropriate authority;
- record times of inspections and presence of authorised persons;
- respond to alarms, sound alarms, check alarm systems, provide armed escort for
- observe and report suspects to police, or apprehend offenders when appropriate and detain them until police arrive;

SECURITY CONTROL ROOM OFFICER

A monitoring security officer personally monitors property using an electronic monitoring device, such as a visual recording system, a radio or remote alarm system.

Duties include:

- monitor computer alarm systems, Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) systems and
- communicate by radio with mobile units to attend alarms;

LICENSED OCCUPATIONS IN THE SECURITY INDUSTRY

CROWD CONTROLLER, BOUNCER OR DOORMAN

This licence authorises you to monitor or control the behaviour of persons, screen persons for entry or remove people for behavioural reasons. This licence is required for licensed premises, places of entertainment and public or private events or functions.

Holders of this type of licence are sometimes known as 'Bouncers' or 'Doormen'.

A Crowd Controller is not permitted to carry any weapon on their person while they are performing Crowd Control activities. This prevents a Crowd Controller from carrying, possessing or using batons or 'pepper sprays'.

SECURITY & CROWD CONTROL OFFICER

This dual licence authorises you to undertake dual roles of Security Guard and or Crowd Controller sometimes known as Bouncers or Doormen.

ARMED CASH IN TRANSIT GUARD OFFICER

Industry participants must have a knowledge of workplace health & safety requirements, be effective communicators and negotiators and have the ability to respond to security incidents while undertaking a cash in transit job role. They must follow procedures, relevant legislation and use of force guidelines & ensure the safe and proficient use of a Category H firearm in the performance of their duties.

LICENSED OCCUPATIONS IN THE SECURITY INDUSTRY

BODYGUARD

This licence authorises you to escort another person as a guard or protector for remuneration. (Section 14A of the Act).

PRIVATE INVESTIGATOR

This licence authorises you to investigate the conduct of individuals or corporations or the character of individuals, perform surveillance work or investigate missing persons. Holders of this licence are sometimes known as 'Private Investigators' or 'Private Eyes'.
