Training Providers' Forum 2014

FAPSTC was one of a number of organisations that participated in the Department of Training and Workforce Development's Training Providers' Forum on 19 and 20 May at the Crown Perth.

Exhibitors included all Training Councils, State and Private training providers, Industry Skills Council's.

Dr Ruth Shean welcomed all attendees and the opening address was delivered by the Hon Minister for Training and Workforce Development, Dr Kim Hames. A number of keynote addresses were held in the mornings and a variety of workshops were conducted in the afternoons.



Workplace Essentials Attraction and Retention publication

The Department of Training and Workforce Development and their project partners have published the fourth in a series of workforce planning and development brochures tailored towards small to medium businesses. The fourth brochure is titled Attracting and Recruiting the People You Need.

The fourth brochure highlights strategies employers can use to attract the right people to work for their business. It discusses five factors which employers can influence to make their business more attractive to new recruits:

- a positive business reputation;
- training and development opportunities;
- flexible working arrangements;
- a competitive salary and benefits; and
- a positive workplace culture.

A good practice guide on WA school-based traineeships

A Good Practice Guide has been developed for all stakeholders involved in school-based apprenticeships and traineeships including students, employers, Group Training Organisations (GTOs), Registered Training Organisations (RTOs), schools, and parents.

The guide demonstrates the roles played by each of these stakeholders and highlights the features of good practice, in particular those aspects that have a positive impact on the effective delivery and beneficial outcomes of school-based apprenticeships and traineeships. ASQA to automatically update a training provider's scope

Commencing 1 July 2014, the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) will automatically update a training provider's domestic scope to include any new, equivalent version of a training product (qualifications and units of competency) they are already registered to deliver.

This process applies to all ASQA Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) with a training package product listed on their scope that an Industry Skills Council has superseded with a new training product that it has deemed equivalent. On 1 July 2014, ASQA will update all training products on an RTO's scope that are in transition, having been superseded by a new equivalent product in the last 12 months. There will be no application required or fee payable.

From 1 July 2014, ASQA will apply this process for all future training package updates. Those providers that do not wish to have the new, equivalent product on scope can choose to opt-out through a simple application process. There is no fee for this.

Independent Review Report of the VET Sector

In October 2013, the Minister for Training and Workforce Development initiated the Independent Review of the Vocational Education and Training (VET) Sector in Western Australia to provide advice on:

- a model for the most appropriate level of autonomy for metropolitan and regional State Training Providers;
- strategies to support the growth of regional State Training Providers in a more open market; and
- a framework for streamlined information flows from industry and the VET sector to the Minister.

Unique Student Identifiers (USI)

Passage of the Student Identifiers Act 2014 through the Senate confirms the 1 January 2015 start date for the Unique Student Identifier (USI) scheme.

Once the Act receives Royal Assent, the Minister for Industry, in consultation with the Ministerial Council, will move quickly to appoint a Registrar to oversee the implementation and ongoing management of the USI scheme.

The Department of Industry will work with training providers and key stakeholders over the coming months to assist with preparation for implementation.

- employ apprentices and trainees and place them with host employers.
